
- 1. Growing Up: Unit Introduction
- 2. "The Bass, the River and Sheila Mant" short story by W.D. Wetherell
 - Audio link story read aloud but no text showing 17-min: <u>http://teacherlink.ed.usu.edu/</u>
 - The narrator of the story is never named. He is a 14-year-old boy who tells his aha story.
- 3. **"I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings"** is an *excerpt* (little part of the book) from Maya Angelou's autobiography.
 - Audio link story read aloud with text on screen 36-min: <u>https://youtu.be/Djs8NDifKB4?t=2072</u>
 - What happens to Maya at her 8th grade graduation that is her "rite of passage"? How does her way of thinking change (her "aha moment")?
 - 22-min recording SUPPLEMENTAL LIVELESSON from Ms. Billett about note-taking for Unit 1 stories as well as specifics on the Maya Angelou "I know Why" story: <u>https://ww2.livelesson.com/p2f4eqwiorqt/</u> ← Be patient. This takes a few steps. Click on "Switch to Classic View" which opens a new window (takes about a minute). If asked, click "Open in Application" and it will open in a LiveLesson window in Connexus. P You *must* be logged into Connexus for this to work.
- 4. **Three poems**: "First Lesson," "On Turning Ten," and "Hanging Fire" (all by different poets). Read the BACKGROUND info on page 44 in *Pathways*.
 - Audio link: "First Lesson" by Phillip Booth poem: no audio yet. Page 45 in *Pathways*
 - Audio link: "Hanging Fire" poem: <u>https://youtu.be/Ur9tcn0o1z8</u>
 - Audio link: "On Turning Ten" the poem (2 min.) <u>https://youtu.be/L-zWoKqIH E</u>; OR a teacher gives an introduction & explanation plus reads the poem (9 min.): <u>youtu.be/SM9aYEe0shU</u>
- 5. **"My Forbidden Face"** This is a true story but is only an excerpt (small part) of the author's entire book. The subtitle is *Growing Up Under the Taliban: A Young Woman's Story*.
 - Audio link: (19 min.) <u>https://ww2.livelesson.com/pwagc92lwxu4/</u> ← Be patient. This takes a few steps. Click on "Switch to **Classic View**" to hear both the background and the story. This will open a new window (takes about a minute). ¹→ You *must* be logged into Connexus for this to work. Background info from pg. 62 <u>and</u> the story from the textbook (pgs. 63-70) are read aloud.
 - Pay close attention to the end for Latifa's "aha moment." Latifa learns something about her own life, but she also sees that Mama has changed.

- 7. "The Scarlet Ibis" by James Hurst [Note: This story is optional for Foundations students.]
 - Audio links: (30 min total)

 - "The Scarlet Ibis" **Part 2** 15 min: <u>https://youtu.be/coBKG7aYizU</u>
 - This story is *not* about the bird; the bird is a symbol. You must infer what the important life lesson Brother (the protagonist/main character) learns because the story doesn't tell us directly (his "aha moment"). You'll have to read between the lines.
- 8. "My Brother's Keeper" by Jay Bennett
 - Audio Link: 20 min

Click on "Switch to Classic View" to hear both the background and the story. This will open a new window (takes about a minute). P You *must* be logged into Connexus for this to work. Background info and the story from the textbook are read aloud.
 - Background info from pg. 144 and the story from the textbook (pgs. 145-158) are read aloud.
